SCHULZE, Allan W., age 59 of Dayton passed away on February 27, 2016 surrounded by his loving family. He was an extraordinary husband and father, a man of generous heart and a well respected Veterinarian. Allan was born in West Chester on May 25, 1956 to Wallace and Roberta Schulze. He attributes his great work ethic and pure heart to his parents, respectively, and was proud to have had a close relationship with them throughout his life. Allan is preceded in death by his son Evan Allan Schulze (2014) whom he missed dearly; brother Gary Schulze, and his nephew Bryan Graham. He is survived by his beloved wife of 33 years, Cindy (Mangold) Schulze; children Jarrod (Ashley) Schulze, Leah (Kris) Wilson; grandson Landon; 2 brothers, 7 sisters and their spouses ; Mother and Father in-law Patsy and Kenneth Gore, numerous nieces and nephews and many close friends and extended family.

After a dedicated education at the Ohio State University, Allan earned his DVM degree in 1982. He practiced veterinary medicine with passion and care for over 30 years as part owner of the Kettering Animal Hospital. He enjoyed golf with his good friends and sunny spring days, but most of all he loved his family and spending time with them. He will live on in every smile of every grandchild, every hug from his children, and every heartbeat of his wife. He would wish only that you love each other, unconditionally, and with full confidence that there is so much good in life and the future that he will watch from above, with a smile and his arm around his son, Evan. A memorial service will be held on Saturday, March 12th at 3:00p.m. at Southminster Presbyterian Church with Dr. Jacqueline Nowak officiating. Hi, my name is Bob Arrom. I was there at Allan's service today but I did not get a chance to give my testimony about his life, so here it goes.

A bright light has been extinguished. A bright light shines no more here on earth. But his light shines now brightly before the the Lord!

Allen Schultze is no more.!

Dressed in white, now smiling , he suffers no more.He has been declared righteous , and now he stands befo re the Lord.

Allen Schultze was my friend.

I had the privilege and honor of going overseas on two mission trips with him.

The first trip was in 2001 to the Amazon Jungle of Peru. His father, Wallie had gone first in the year 2,000, and has helped us build a church bad three other church building and three other church structures in the village of Nieva, deep in the Herat of the Amazon Jungle.

We had travelled there four hours in small boats with outboard engines.

His father Wallie has helped nail the tin roof onto the church buildings, having climmed up thirty feet to the rafters.

We were afraid he was going to fall from there and break all his bones.

Perhaps because of this, Allen decided to come with us the next year.

On this trip we were robbed at gun point after leaving the impotence in Lima, the capital city of Peru.

We lost all our belongings and most of our missio supplies.

Allen was part of our medical team. We were poised to do fifty surgeries in the jungle.

We made the decision to still go on , denying Satan a victory.

At the mission station of Nuevo Horizonte we saw patients. We treated them ones we could, and selected four Aguaruno Indian women who needed hysterectomies to come with us to the nearest hospital six hours away .

We took them and their.companions on vans down delapidaded routs to the hospital in Baguz. There we persuaded the hospital director to allow us to perform these surgeries there.

We then went on the hospital ambulance to to a pharmacy in town to purchase the necessary supplies: sutures, IV tubing, IV fluids , urine catheters, antibiotics and pain medicine and dressings.

Allen assisted me in these surgeries.

He was my roommate in Bagua.

In 2003 he came with us to work at the Kudjip Nazarene Hospital in Papua New Guinea.

We were a group of ten members.. He assisted me there in many surgeries, being and outstanding surgeon . He also operated on several dogs at the mission station. Over the years, Allen and I continued our friendship . He took care of three of our dogs.

I prayed with Allen many times on those mission trips. We always had morning devotions and evening prayers.

I can say without the shadow of a doubt that he knew Gog, and served others with reverence for God.

I know that he has been welcomed home by our Heavenly Father.

In the Gospel it is written that we should run the race of life with dignity and courage.

In 2 Timothy 4:6 the Apostle Pauld says,

"For I have been poured out like a drink offering, and the time has come for my departure. I have fought the good fight. I have finished the race. I have kept the faith, and now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award me on that day - and not only for me, but also to all who have longed for his appearance."

I know beyond the shadow of doubt, that Allen now has the crown of righteousness, reserved for all who love the Lord.

We have now a cloud of witnesses as stated in Hebrews chapter 12: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us run with perseverance the race marked for us."

Now Allen is part of that great cloud of witnesses that stand before the Lord, and speak on our behalf.

I thank the Lord for Allen Schultze, a bright light that bore witness to his faith, a light that will never be extinguished, and who now lives in the lives he touched while he lived here on earth.

“ My husband and I got our first pet, a dog we named Barnaby, in 1974. Since 1974 we have shared our home with a multitude of cats and dogs and always trusted their care to Kettering Animal Hospital. Over the years Dr. Schulze euthanized three of our dogs—Barnaby, Peewee and Cassie—all in their senior years and all due to cancer. I remember how, after putting Barnaby to sleep, he asked us to remain in the parking lot to compose ourselves before driving home. When Dr. Schulze couldn't figure out what ailed Peewee, he scheduled an appointment for her with Dr. Rogers at the Dayton Emergency Clinic then surprised us--on his day off—by joining us there for that appointment. We also recall how Dr. Schulze and some of the other staff stayed one evening after the clinic closed to perform emergency surgery on Cassie to remove what a specialist's report indicated was a probable cancerous gall bladder. When the surgery found that cancer had spread to other organs, Dr. Schulze put Cassie to sleep for us while she was still under the anesthetic. I remember his hug as we sobbed our hearts out. For 30 years we knew Dr. Schulze to be an incredibly kind person whose compassion for animals extended to the humans who loved them so. We send our heartfelt sympathy to those fortunate enough to have known him as family or friend.
